A Letter from Rick Toalson / CCI Member

Note: This letter was written by Rick several month ago and we failed to get it in the newsletter until now. Please take the time to read as he talks of the great relationships that he and Tammy have made with our Country Coach Family.

I do not recall exactly when we purchased our first Country Coach. It was sometime in 2002 and it was a beautiful ride. We kept it until Tammy found our 1999 Magna on Ebay in 2004. We bought it in August and it was our home away from home for almost nine years. We have owned our current 2006 Affinity for eight and a half years now and it has taken us on more adventures than we have any right to ask for.

While the times and dates blur with the passing of the years, there has been one constant, our Country Coach family. We attended our very first CC rally in 2004 in New Orleans, LA. The very first person I met was Bob Harbrecht. He was walking his Sheltie pup and I was walking ours. Since the first day we have remained close friends. We have been to each other's homes, shared meals, great times and challenging times as well. Bob and Ruth even came by after Hurricane Michael to help us pick up our shattered homestead. They are dear friends and we love them. We were saddened when we heard that Ruth passed away this last February, 2022.

Tammy and I were on the phone with Debbie and Gary Glenn the night before the terrible accident that took Gary's life. I was just listening in while Tammy was on the speakerphone talking CC business, rallies, and generic stuff. I always feel obliged to throw a smart comment in now and then to keep in the conversation.

I can vividly recall meeting Gary and Debbie for the first time. Gary was perched in a comfortable chair with an adult beverage in hand sitting by their Magna. Anyone that knows me can vouch that I will almost always stop and talk with someone. (My mom said that I never met a stranger). Debbie came out and offered me a refreshment and a chair and that was the beginning. Rallies, a fabulous trip to DC, meals, drinks, lies and stories all fell in line behind that day.

Gary took to the club and made things happen. When no one stepped up to do something, he would say, "Hell, I'll do it!". Gary and Debbie were just special. They put so much into our group and I know that I didn't say thank you for all they did. That is true for all of the men and women that make this club function and stay together. I want to say thank you all right now. Your efforts change our lives.

When the phone rang about Gary's accident, I just went numb. We knew it was bad, but we prayed for the best. I thought about the phone call I chimed in on and wished I had said something meaningful to our friend who was fighting for his life. I am sorry that I haven't reached out to you Debbie. You have been in my prayers and my heart. I can not imagine what you have endured. Gary and you seemed so perfect for each other and we loved our time together with you two.

We had a great time at that rally and every other one we have attended. The friends we made during this Country Coach tenure have been nothing short of amazing. Buddy Bordes and Pete Hayes came to our home after Hurricane Michael and helped clean up and they both brought supplies. Most of the time immediately after the storm is a blur. I was in shock from the all of the damage.

What is clear in my mind is who showed up to help us. That was our CC family. We were at a rally in Tennessee when the storm hit. Our friends at the rally filled our car with supplies to take back to Panama City for us. Thank you all for that very kind gesture.

We dropped our coach off with Al and Billie Stewart in Columbus, GA and drove our supply filled car to our home in Florida. I met them at our Shipshewana, IN rally years before. They watched our dog for us and while we made a four hour one-way trip to Panama City to survey the damages. Thanks to our Country Coach friends, Al and Billie, too. Your kindness during those difficult times will never be forgotten.

My brother asked me why in the world I take the time to go meet a bunch of people I barely know. It was easy to answer, because the people we know, the new people we get to meet, and the times we have are irreplaceable. The kindness, friendship and helpfulness we have enjoyed since our first Country Coach rally have surpassed anything I ever would have dreamed of.

Our coach was in the shop getting a new front suspension and Tammy had asked if anyone had any recommendations on where we could stay while we were out of the coach in Oregon. The fires and unrest in the region made finding a place in a hotel or B&B impossible. Our Country Coach family came to the rescue again. We spent five days with Rick and Mary Adams at their llama ranch in Bend, OR. We had a fabulous time and I felt more relaxed than I have in years. Thank you Rick and Mary for sharing your beautiful home with Tammy and I.

I could go on but you should get the picture. We are a group that helps each other. We don't have to get together often to care about each other. I do not hesitate to say that in a lot of cases, my Country Coach friends are closer than a lot of my family. Family is who loves you, not just who you are related to.

Getting a Country Coach and getting to know all of these people, and hundreds more that I have not yet had a chance to meet, is a blessing. Our times together provide a respite from our daily lives.

Gary Glenn's and Ruth Harbrecht's passing is a hard reminder that our time together is too short and not promised. It is easy to see them in my mind. Some good friends that I wish I had spent more time with. So for all of you that know me, I want to apologize for not keeping in touch as much as I would like to. Thank you all for being in our group and enriching our lives. My fervent hope is that everyone will take some time to acknowledge the important people in their lives. We won't always have a chance to do that.

Insider tips for properly maintaining your motorcoach

It seems that anytime two or more coach owners are gathered around the campground, it doesn't take long for a conversation to start. Odds are that this conversation will quickly turn to the topic of preventive maintenance; "How often are you changing your oil?" "Have you tried that new synthetic transmission fluid yet?" "Do you rotate your tires?" Seems like everyone has an opinion as to the best way to maintain their motorcoach.

Most of us have heard or read about the most common preventive maintenance tasks: oil change intervals, air filter replacements, and so on. Following are some items that may not have occurred to you in a while.

1. EXTENDED LIFE COOLANTS

Some owners are changing over to one of the extended life coolants (ELC) now on the market. Due to the reduced maintenance schedule, this is an increasingly popular alternative to using standard coolant. However, it is essential to use the correct coolant filter. If you have already changed over to ELC, make sure that your service technician is aware of this and uses the correct filter, at the correct interval, which can be found in your chassis maintenance manual. Correct ELC filters do not contain any of the Supplemental Coolant Additives (SCA) designed for standard coolants. Also, please note that standard coolant and ELC are not compatible. Do not mix the two in the same engine. If you are not the original owner of your coach, you should consider having a qualified service center check your coolant to see which type is in use. At the same time, the technicians can also use a coolant test strip to sample the SCA levels to determine if they need to be refreshed.

If you decide to switch to an alternative specification coolant and wish to reduce the risk of contamination with an incompatible coolant when you have your coach in for service, simply adhere a label to the surge tank that is readily visible, and clearly identifies the specification of the coolant used in the system.

2. AIR SYSTEM

The air system is another important part of the chassis that shouldn't be over-looked in routine preventive maintenance. Purge the air tank regularly (daily if you're driving lots of miles) and note whether any water is expelled from the purge valves. On Allures and Intrigues, these purge valves are located on the forward wall of the steering compartment (first bay, driver's side). On Magnas, Affinitys and

Lexas, these valves are located behind the passenger side front bumper, and are operated using the 'Air Tank Purge' switch located on either the shifter console. or the console behind the driver's seat. The ignition must be on when operating this system. A small amount of moisture is normal in humid conditions, or if the system has not been purged for some time. However, greater amounts of water expressed during regular purging could indicate a problem within the system that requires attention. In addition to causing corrosion within the air system, water within the lines can freeze, causing possible damage to control valves and air springs. Also, do not neglect the air dryer desiccant cartridge. For best performance, it should be changed out every two years or 50,000 miles.



3. OVER-THE-ROAD A/C

Another "dryer" that can become easily neglected is the receiver/dryer in the dash (or over-the-road) air conditioner system. This dryer should be replaced any time that the system's refrigerant has been evacuated to allow servicing or replacement of components in the system.

4. WATER HEATER ANODE

Does your water heater have a sacrificial anode? If you have a Suburban heater, the answer is probably "yes". The purpose of the anode is to sacrifice itself to the electrolysis process that takes place in all water heaters where heavy metals and salt are present in the water. To avoid excessive corrosion of the water heater's tank, this anode should be inspected annually for signs of deterioration. The anode should be replaced when it has deteriorated more than 25% (see image below). However, the anode itself is inexpensive and it is wise to replace it annually as a matter of routine. The manufacturer's documentation for your water heater should identify the exact location of the anode if one indeed exists. To inspect or replace the anode, first turn off the water heater at both the monitor panel, and the breaker in the distribution panel. Allow some time for the water to cool before proceeding. Next, turn off the water pump, and disconnect the city water. With this step complete, drain the water from the heater using either the faucet in the water bay, or low point drains, also located in the water bay adjacent to the water pump. Lastly, use a suitably sized socket and handle to remove the anode.

5. A TUNED RIDE

A subject that is especially deserving of periodic focus is ride height, weight, balance, tire pressure and alignment. These can be some of the most important items to check on your coach. Letting any of these areas get out of specification can negatively impact coach handling and tire wear. Have you ever noticed that the bays can mysteriously collect items as you travel around the country? The weight of these items can add up over time and require some redistribution to bring the balance of the coach back to proper trim. New coach owners should pay close attention to this weight distribution until they are familiar with their coach, and it is a good idea to have the alignment checked once the coach has been loaded with personal belong-

ings, and a few trips have been completed. The coach was aligned carefully at the factory, but this alignment can change with the additional weight of these personal items.

6. TRANSMISSION FLUID

Tired of changing out the transmission fluid so frequently? Consider switching to the 'TranSynd' synthetic fluid recommended by Allison. This will not only extend the service interval but will likely benefit the transmission as well.

The list of preventive maintenance items for a diesel coach is quite extensive and detailed. It's always easy to overlook an item that comes due on a time basis, rather than a mileage basis. Give the manual another reading and you'll probably find something in there that you've forgotten about. Then the next time you get into one of those maintenance discussions with another owner, you'll be able to bring up something new.
